Summary of Survey Findings

• A questionnaire was made available to West Caln Township residents via internet and hard copy as a means to gather input on various land planning issues. The online survey was posted on the Township website. A hard copy of the survey was mailed to 2,775 households in the Township (this is the number of households for which the county has address information). A total of 256 responses were received – 153 online and 103 hard copy survey responses. Assuming each response represents one household, the response rate is 9%.

- Most survey respondents are long-time residents. Just over one-half of the responses are from long-time residents who have lived in the Township for 20 years or more. Approximately 75% of respondents have lived in the Township for more than 10 years. Approximately 10% of respondents are newer residents that have lived in the Township for 3 years or less.
- The survey indicates that residents greatly value the Township's rural character, open spaces and farmlands, woodlands and natural features, and privacy and seclusion. Preservation of these features is of utmost importance to residents. They have a very strong desire to keep the Township as it is (i.e., rural) and to prevent development from sprawling throughout the Township.
- Residents are generally satisfied with township services and recreational opportunities, but suggest a
 need for better road maintenance, road improvements, and speed enforcement; more opportunities for
 safe walking and biking; and better communication with residents. High taxes are also a concern.
- There is not strong support for more housing or diverse housing types, expansion of business and commercial services, or expansion of public sewer and water service.
- The most important improvement needs are as follows (based on ranking responses to the "Improvement Needs" questions by their weighted average scores):
 - Preserve natural resources
 - Preserve open space and farmland
 - Preserve historic resources
 - Better road maintenance, Road improvements
 - More opportunities for safe walking and biking
 - Better township communications
 - Speed enforcement
 - Traffic management
 - Better EMS and fire protection services
 - More park and recreation opportunities
 - More police protection
 - Better enforcement of zoning regulations
- Of those that mentioned keeping of horses, most were in favor of reducing the 3-acre minimum.

Number of people in your household by age group.



How long have you lived in West Caln Township?






Most survey respondents are long-time residents. Just over one-half of the respondents have lived in the Township for 20 years or more. Approximately 75% of respondents have lived in the Township for more than 10 years. Approximately 10% of respondents are newer residents that have lived in the Township for 3 years or less.

Significant Features

What do you like most about living in West Caln Township?



Fire protection, police, EMS, and recreation and parks received high scores (see the weighted average column), followed by township administrative services and road maintenance which received more moderate scores. This indicates that residents are satisfied with fire, police, and EMS services, and parks and recreation, and that there is room for improvement in township administrative services and road maintenance.



Rural character and seclusion/privacy received high scores (see weighted average column) followed by neighborhood/community life, variety of housing types, and access to nearby urban centers. Retail services received a relatively low score of 2.95. This indicates that residents overwhelmingly like the Township's rural character and seclusion. They are less enthused about retail services.



Parks and playgrounds, trails/paths, and fishing and waterway activities received relatively high scores (see weighted average column) indicating that residents like these recreational opportunities. Events and programs, bicycling, and youth athletic programs received lower scores indicating that residents are less satisfied with these recreational opportunities.


Natural/cultural features




All natural and cultural features received high scores, indicating that residents overwhelmingly like these features. Groundwater quality scored slightly lower indicating that there may be some dissatisfaction with it.

Improvement Needs / Opportunities


Potential actions needed to improve the quality of living in West Caln.




Road maintenance and snow removal services received a high score (weighted average of 4.03 out of 5), indicating that improving these services is important to residents. This is followed by more road improvements, more opportunities for safe walking and biking, and control speeding. Addressing traffic congestion received a more neutral score. Better access to public transportation received a rather low score, indicating that it is not very important to residents.



All resource preservation categories received high scores (weighted average more than 4 out of 5), indicating that resource preservation is very important to residents. Groundwater quality received the highest score.



All categories received neutral to low scores (weighted average of 3 or less). Better enforcement of zoning regulations is somewhat important (weighted average 3.05 out of 5). All other categories are of relatively low importance to residents.



All categories received relatively low scores (weighted average under 3) indicating that business and commercial services are not very important to residents.



Improved township communication/notification received a moderately high score, indicating that it is important to residents. Better EMS, fire protection, parks and recreation, and police protection received neutral scores; indicating that they are somewhat important to residents. Coordinated/improved trash collection and expanded access to public sewer and water service received relatively low scores, indicating that they are not very important to residents.

What do you like most about living in West Caln Township?

Responses indicate that residents particularly like the Township's rural character and related aspects of a rural community, including open space and farmland, quiet, privacy, scenery, woodlands and wildlife. Respondents like their location and access to services (including shops and recreation), the people in the community, parks, the police, and the Amish community. A very small number of respondents mention a lack of traffic.

Responses indicate that residents are not satisfied with road conditions and maintenance, traffic, and taxes.

Respondents cited growth and development as the most significant problem the Township will face in the next five years, followed by traffic and roads, and loss of open space and farms. High taxes, the school system, water quality and supply, and infrastructure are also concerns.

Do you have any concerns/suggestions regarding township zoning and land development regulations?

The vast majority of respondents suggest preserving open space and farmland, keeping the Township rural, and not allowing/strictly limiting new development.

Because there has been discussion at Task Force meetings about the 3-acre minimum for horses, we specifically search for this issue among the survey responses and found that eleven respondents mentioned keeping of horses or animals: ten are in favor of reducing the 3-acre minimum requirement for horses, two are in favor of a 3 acre minimum for animals.

Other issues/concerns/suggestions?

Roads (conditions, traffic, maintenance, snow removal) received the largest amount of mentions in the responses to this question followed by high taxes and speeding. Noise from motorbikes, guns, and traffic is mentioned as is the need for township trash service and clean-up of unkempt properties and roadsides.

Of the nine mentions of public sewer, four are in favor of it and 5 are against it.

Of the six mentions of public water, one is in favor of it and 5 are against it.

Of the eight mentions of police, five are in favor of expanding the force and/or providing 24 hour service, two wish to keep it small, and one suggests that the police should get to know the community more.
