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**A RESOLUTION OF THE WEST CALN TOWNSHIP  
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS REGARDING THE  
MUNICIPAL DECLARATION OF DISASTER  
EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, on or about March 14th, 2020 Coronavirus COVID-19 has caused or threatens to cause injury, damage, and suffering to the persons and property of West Caln Township (the "Township"), Chester County, Pennsylvania further substantiated by multiple confirmed cases of COVID-19 within Chester County and the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency issued by Pennsylvania Governor Tom Wolf; and

**WHEREAS**, the Coronavirus COVID-19 has endangered the health, safety and welfare of a substantial number of persons residing in the Township and threatens to create problems greater in scope than the Township may be able to resolve including substantial public health, medical, and emergency response burdens; and

**WHEREAS**, emergency management measures are required to reduce the severity of this disaster and to protect the health, safety and welfare of affected residents in the Township.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, we, the undersigned Supervisors of West Caln Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania, pursuant to the provisions of Section 7501 of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Services Code, (35 PA C.S., Section 7501), as amended, do hereby declare the existence of a disaster emergency in the Township.

**FURTHER**, we direct the Township's Emergency Management Coordinator to coordinate the activities of the emergency response, to take all appropriate action needed to alleviate the effects of this disaster, to aid in the restoration of essential public services, and to take any other emergency response action deemed necessary to respond to this emergency.

**STILL FURTHER**, we authorize officials of the Township to act as necessary to meet the current exigencies of this emergency, namely: by the employment of temporary workers, by the rental of equipment, by the purchase of supplies and materials, and by entering into such contracts and agreements for the performance of public work as may be required to meet the emergency, all without regard to those time-consuming procedures and formalities normally prescribed by law, mandatory constitutional requirements excepted.

**IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED** that West Caln Township hereby extends all for any required municipal action to the fullest extent permitted by law.


**WHEREAS**, given that the need for immediate and continuing emergency management measures are required to mitigate and reduce the severity of this public health emergency for purposes of protecting the health, safety and welfare of residents in West Caln Township, the West Caln Township Board of Supervisors have determined the necessity to continue its Declaration of Disaster Emergency and by this Resolution intend that the emergency situation status confronting the County as memorialized by its initial Declaration and this Continuing Resolution be authorized until officially terminated by the West Caln Township Board of Supervisors.

**This Declaration shall take effect immediately**


